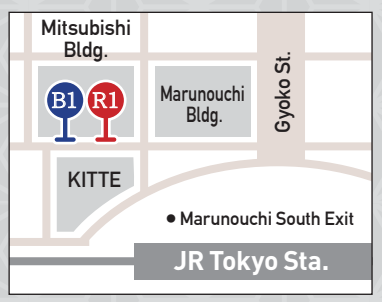

**Marunouchi Mitsubishi Building**

Tokyo station, a 6-minute walk from the bus stop, is a terminal station with a rich history of more than 100 years. The “Marunouchi Ekisha” has been designated an Important Cultural Property, and was restored to its original grandeur in 2012.

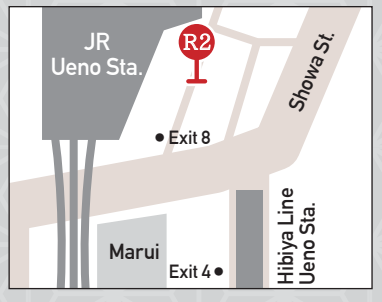

**Ueno Station**

Weekends and holidays only

There are many attractions at Ueno Park, including the Tokyo National Museum, as well as the National Museum of Western Art. Nearby is also the popular Yanesen area. It's a great spot to walk around old streets while trying out various snacks.

**TOKYO SKYTREE Station**

At Solamachi, which also serves as TOKYO SKYTREE's entrance, you can go shopping on the first floor's Japanese-style “Station Street.” Also don't miss the fourth floor “Japan Souvenir Street.”

**Asakusa Hanakawado**

Senso-ji is only five minutes from the bus stop. On the nearby Nakamise Shopping Street are many Japanese confectionery shops selling Kaminari Okoshi and fresh senbei crackers. There are many Japanese-style souvenir stores as well as rickshaw ride services.

**Ueno Matsuzakaya**

On Ameyoko, a shopping street filled with local color, you can buy food, clothing, and more at discount prices. If you walk five minutes towards Ueno Station from the bus stop, you'll arrive at Ueno Park, which has a variety of museums.

**Akihabara (Suehirocho)**

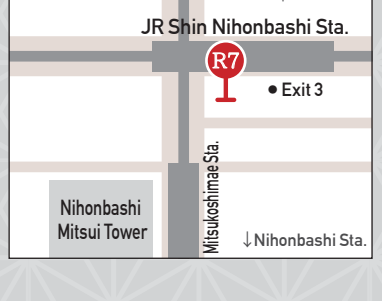
Tokyo's most famous electronics shopping area. There are shops selling anime goods, as well as cafes with waitresses dressed up like maids. You can also see them handing out flyers along the street.

**Shin-Nihonbashi Station**

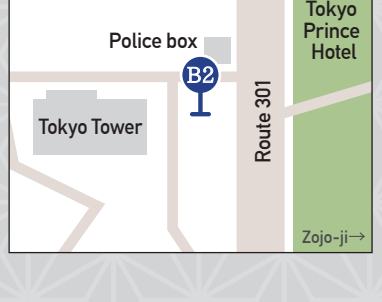
There are shops selling traditional Japanese kimonos in Mitsukoshi. With your ticket you can ride a shuttle bus that goes around Nihonbashi. It's a great opportunity to visit Ningyocho's Amazake Yokocho for a taste of a bustling old-time downtown environment.

**Tokyo Tower**

On the third floor is One Piece Tower, a theme park for the Japanese anime One Piece. The nearby temple Zojo-ji is a great place to take a photograph with Tokyo Tower in the background.

**Tsukiji Ginza**

Tsukiji Market is Japan's largest fish market. There are many places offering fresh seafood cuisine as well as Japan's tamago-yaki omelets. Ginza is filled with Japan's top luxury brand stores. You'll also find the tallest shop in the world of the Japanese brand Uniqlo.
